Things have been moving on apace recently in the Association, with the coffee get-togethers recommencing in autumn. A particular highlight was the get-together at Dovecot Studio's where we






amazed at the skill of the Fair Isle knitters. Similarly it was interesting to see some of the fashions for other areas of Europe on display along with designer garments from Chanel and





Schiaparelli.

Madras lodge update: as many of you will know there have been on-going issues with drains at Madras lodge for over 4 years. We are very happy to be able to report that after extensive work, about 2 metres of tree root were removed from the shared sewer pipes in the grounds of Seaforth - the house next door - and the pipes resealed to prevent further ingress of roots. This has now removed all drainage smells in the house bathroom, however, as the drains date from 1890's we do need to be careful about what is washed down the sinks and toilets, so signage has been put up to remind us all of the appropriate materials. Namely, only toilet paper and water! As many of you who attended the AGM will know, we are embarking on a slightly Covid delayed refurbishment of both properties which requires the properties to be closed to bookings for 3 months, January to March. During this period heating systems in both properties will be replaced and some upgrading of the electrical systems will be undertaken as these are now non-compliant with current legislation. We have taken advice from heating engineers as to the most cost effective and controllable systems to use and these will be installed. Following this work, we will be upgrading and decorating the properties one room at a time. We hope to be able to improve the insulation and make the properties more sustainable in their use of resources. This work will require us to do some relocating of furniture with non-fire regulation compliant pieces being replaced, there will also be rationalisation of crockery etc.

If anyone wishes to assist either by joining working parties, or by offering support in other ways we will be sending out regular e-mail updates as to progress. We would hope to have an open house event later in the Spring to offer you all the chance to see the work undertaken so far. As always we rely on the goodwill of volunteers who work on the committees and we would be happy to discuss how the committees work with anyone who might be interested in joining us to support the continuing success of the Association and Madras Lodge.

We will shortly be posting on the website a short history of Madras lodge since its construction between 1890 and 1906. We have gained some very interesting insights into the building which you might be interested to learn about.

Links with QMU- Sir Paul Grice (Principal) is extremely interested in the Association and its work, and is keen to have a better working relationship with us. To this end I, and Julie(Convenor Madras lodge) are meeting with him in January to discuss ways in which we can work together to ensure the on-going viability of the association and Madras Lodge. I have regular meetings with Thomas Kelly who heads the Alumni department at QMU, and we hope to work together in the future to hold joint events.
